



## **New president of Medical Center Company brings broad energy management experience**

John Bradley, a seasoned executive with broad experience in both traditional utilities work and alternative energy and sustainability, has been named president of the Medical Center Company (MCCo), a nonprofit corporation that provides utility services to Case Western Reserve University, University Hospitals, and other nonprofit institutions in University Circle.

Bradley, selected after a national search, begins his new position Oct. 17.

“John Bradley’s industry experience and leadership ability are key attributes to support the strategic direction of MCCo as it moves forward into a more sustainable world,” said MCCo chair Bradley Bond.

“John Bradley was the unanimous choice of the search committee. He impressed everyone he met, over the course of several interviews, with his understanding of MCCo and the industry,” said Robert Brown, MCCo vice chair and search committee chair.

Bradley was previously associate vice president for sustainability, energy and technical services at New York University. In that capacity, he managed NYU’s utility services and helped direct the university’s sustainability programs.

In addition, Bradley was involved in the construction, commissioning and operation of NYU’s \$130 million cogeneration facility, which provides half of the university’s energy needs, and oversaw the technical management of a portfolio of 140 buildings totaling more than 14 million square feet.

At NYU, Bradley created the institution’s sustainability program, expanded its recycling operations and developed and implemented an energy strategy that lowered greenhouse gas emissions by about one-third.

Bradley earned a bachelor’s degree in nuclear engineering from New York Maritime College and a master of business administration from the University of Delaware. While working at NYU, he also earned a master’s degree in Global Affairs, Energy & Environmental Policy, and holds Certified Energy Manager, Certified Building Commissioning Professional and Certified Lighting Efficiency Professional designations.

MCCo is a district energy company formed in 1932 as a not-for-profit corporation to consolidate and conserve energy distribution within the nonprofit corporations of University Circle. MCCo provides utility services to many of Cleveland’s prominent nonprofit institutions (listed here: <http://www.mcco.org/About-US/Members.html>)
